
Dear Emmaus community:

With all this time on my hands, I sometimes ask why I haven't accomplished more, but I will say that having more solitude is a blessing and I have been reflecting upon my role in this big expanse we call the universe and the mighty God that created it.

In studying scripture during this pandemic there are many passages that I can reflect upon. One scripture I've often referred to, and is appropriate during this time, is Mt 6:25-34 where Jesus tells us not to worry. He starts out by saying (v. 25,26) Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink,[c] or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? 26 Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?

The worldwide decisions to postpone Walks and Emmaus programs is a situation none of us could have ever imagined. The impact on the Upper Room and Emmaus ministries headquartered in Nashville will be significant as their operations depend on Pilgrim fees and contributions from Emmaus communities, which are not being received at this time. The international program of Emmaus ministries headquartered in Nashville provide the program materials and on-going support for our local Emmaus communities.


De Colores Everyone,







Reflection

How has your time of social distancing, insolation, whatever you call it been? For me, the first two weeks were really hard. My depression came on and I distanced from everything and everyone. The second weekend of Face 2 Face had been canceled. There was no church - that is my family; no grouping - those are my sisters; my daughter and son in law were leaving in their RV for who knows where or how long they would be gone. And for the first time in 60 years I had no dog (If you are a dog or cat person you get this). I was alone in my house with my own thoughts and getting more depressed by the day, watching the news (that will do it to you). Luckily one of my sisters called to check in and I shared how I was. I am always the caregiver, not the care receiver, but I needed help. Her first suggestion was get a dog, the one thing I had control over. I went to Frosted Faces, a rescue for senior dogs, and brought home Mrs. Claus (who is now Honey), a shepherd mix. I was giving her a second chance. Little did I realize that is what she is doing for me. My world started to brighten I went back to my daily devotions and reached out for help to my sisters (our grouping has been meeting every Sat. for 9 years). We started church services online, hymn sings and Bible studies with Zoom. My Genesis CBS class met on Zoom and my study group is doing the Relationship Principles of Jesus (highly recommend) by Tom Holladay, teaching Pastor at Saddleback Church. We even had an Emmaus Board meeting on Zoom where we prayed for you, our community. One small group I am in found a way to social distance and make 100 lunches for Interfaith. The sewing group made over 1000 masks for Palomar hospital and members of our church. I am part of a group calling our seniors just to check on them and let them know they are not forgotten. This is a huge blessing, hearing their stories and sharing a prayer. Out of the darkness God has given me Life, Light and His ever-loving presence. Where have you seen God at work in you and those around you? "Find rest, O my soul. In God alone; my hope comes from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation; he is my fortress, I will not be shaken. Psalm 62: 5-6
